What Technology Allows Us to Do in our Teaching: A Conversation with Logan McCarty

Logan McCarty is the director of physical sciences education at Harvard University, where he serves on the faculty of the departments of physics and chemistry and chemical biology. A recipient of many awards for outstanding teaching, McCarty has helped create new interdisciplinary courses to teach science to undergraduates. He’s recently received a grant to redesign a “Black Box” classroom into an innovative, experimental learning space to inspire creative approaches to teaching. He serves on several university committees devoted to improving undergraduate teaching and learning, and helps to train PhD students to become better teachers.
