What is aphasia? Aphasia is the loss of the ability to use or understand language. Aphasia can affect speech, reading, writing, and understanding conversation. Aphasia is caused by damage to the communication areas of the brain. It is most often a result of stroke and is sometimes caused by a head injury or a brain tumor.

The mission of the Tulsa Aphasia Group is to provide education and support to persons with aphasia and their families. The group meets on the second Wednesday of each month (except for June and July) at the Center for Individuals with Physical Challenges, 815 South Utica Avenue, classroom #3. In addition, the group meets for lunch on the last Thursday on each month at Diamond Jacks at 7031 South Zurich Ave. Faculty and students in the Department of Communication Disorders coordinate the group and provide information on coping with Aphasia.
