EDUCATOR TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS

All full-time Oklahoma elementary or secondary school teachers and administrators who qualify for admission to the Graduate School and wish to enroll on a part-time basis may apply for a two-thirds tuition scholarship.

This scholarship may be applied to any graduate coursework taken at The University of Tulsa and is not restricted to courses or degree programs in the School of Education. TU offers graduate coursework and degrees in anthropology, art, English language and literature, history, clinical and industrial/organizational psychology, speech/language pathology, museum science and management, business administration, finance, taxation, applied mathematics, biological sciences, chemistry and biochemistry, computer science, physics and engineering physics, geosciences, as well as chemical, electrical, mechanical, and petroleum engineering.

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION GRADUATE PROGRAMS

The Master of Science in Math and Science Education (M.S.M.S.E.) is a research-based program designed to provide a background in mathematics and science principles and their application in the classroom. The M.S.M.S.E. includes courses in professional education, educational research, and electives selected based on the student's interest and background. This program is for certified and practicing elementary and middle school teachers who wish to enhance their subject matter knowledge and skill in science and math.

The Master of Teaching Arts (M.T.A.) is designed to empower practicing K-12 teachers to master the central concepts of their chosen academic discipline. Educators in this program complete coursework in professional education as well as a specific academic discipline (art, English, history, theatre, biology, and mathematics). The M.T.A. program helps teachers to develop their ability to think critically and speak and write clearly in the appropriate genres for their field of study.

The Master of Arts (M.A.) offers two concentrations. The concentration in *Language, Discourse, and Development* focuses on early language development and classroom discourse, specifically emphasizing the links between components and structures of oral and written language. Coursework covers the study of discourse, including speech act theory, conversation, and text structure. The concentration in *Educational Foundations* explores fundamental questions about the meaning, purpose, and significance of education from philosophical and historical perspectives. Students take a range of courses addressing topics such as the educational thought of the ancient Greeks, the history of American education, theories of moral and civic education, and major debates in contemporary education policy.

The Master of Education (M.Ed.) prepares students for initial Oklahoma certification in elementary or secondary Education. Students must confer with the Graduate Advisor and Education Certification Officer to determine what type of certification/licensure is appropriate for their content area.
