**It is the responsibility of each student, particularly non-TU students using financial aid through their home institutions, to have payment arrangements in place by the first day of the program, June 6<sup>th</sup>.** Be sure you have a clear understanding by asking the financial aid office at your home school about the process of using financial aid for study abroad programs offered by other universities. Some schools may pay TU directly, but most pay a portion and then issue a check directly to the student. However, students receiving a check from their home institution may still have a balance with TU. Please check your TU statement and make sure the balance is paid in full.

<sup>2</sup> Housing for 30 nights. Students are permitted to find housing on their own in non-program facilities.

<sup>3</sup> Cost will vary depending on the number and type of courses selected and could be lower.

<sup>4</sup> Airfare estimate is based on prices for program dates available as of October 2013 and may be adjusted if fares significantly increase or decrease in spring 2014. Fares vary substantially and lower tickets may be obtained via student discount websites.

<sup>5</sup> Students could eat for considerably less by preparing meals in their apartment kitchens. There is a small grocery store on campus and larger supermarkets within a short bus ride. Frequent meals in off-campus restaurants will considerably increase food costs over the amount listed.

<sup>6</sup> A monthly bus pass in Dublin costs approximately 125 euro. Amounts for travel outside Dublin will vary and are not included in this estimate.

<sup>7</sup> This amount will also vary considerably based on the entertainment preferences of individual students.

## **SUMMER IN IRELAND: Institute in European and International Law Dublin: June 6<sup>th</sup> - July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2014**

In the summer of 2014, the University of Tulsa's summer program will enjoy its sixteenth year of operation as an ABA-accredited study abroad program.

### **OUR WONDERFUL STUDENTS**

The program welcomes students in good standing from any accredited American or Canadian law school who have completed the first year of legal study, full-time or part-time, as well as any attorney admitted to the practice of law in these countries. In 2011, 65% of the 43 students participating in the program were from American law schools other than the University of Tulsa College of Law. In 2012, 38% of the 34 American students participating were from other law schools, and in 2013, 33% of the 40 participating American students were from other American law schools. In addition, in 2012, 8 Irish law students participated in the program, and in 2013, 4 Irish law students participated in the program. The anticipated enrollment for summer 2014 is between 30-40 American law students and 4-8 Irish law students.

### **UCD – OUR HOME IN DUBLIN**

Our classroom and program housing are located on the Belfield campus of University College Dublin, a 15 minute bus ride (4 km) from city center. Classes are in a modern classroom with wi-fi internet access. UCD is home to over 16,000 students during the regular academic year and has all the facilities you would expect at a major university, including a student union, small convenience stores, several eating places, sports facilities, a library, computer labs, and laundry facilities. Students and the Program Director will reside in nearby dormitories, in six-room suites with a common living room and kitchen. Each student will have an individual bedroom and private bathroom. The program administrative office is located in the Director's Suite. Students have the option to find their own housing in Dublin.

### **ACCESSIBILITY FOR PERSONS WITH SPECIAL CHALLENGES**

We have accommodated students with physical challenges in the past and we will make every effort to reasonably accommodate applicants with special needs. Our classroom is accessible by elevator and there are some dorm rooms that are especially designed to be accessible for physically challenged students. Most cities in Europe, including Dublin, are not as accessible to persons with physical challenges as are some cities in the United States, although many of the city buses are accessible. Access to some offices and other facilities on the UCD campus is limited. If you require special accommodations, please consult with our Program Director as early as possible so that we can determine whether the facilities of the program can accommodate your particular needs and the availability of these facilities.
